BORDER ASSEMBLY MEASURE WIDTH AND LENGTH OF THE QUILT TOP TO ENSURE F BORDER SIZES, BELOW ARE OUR CUTTING SIZES.


- **13.** Sew (1) **F** 3" x (68-1/2") strip to each side of the **Center Block**. Sew (1) **F** 3" x (56-1/2") strips to the top and bottom of **Center Block** to make the quilt top. **Trim quilt top to measure 54-1/2"** x 72-1/2".
- **14.** Sew (12) **Side Blocks** together to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks. Sew (1) strip to each side of the quilt top.

15. Sew (2) **Corner Blocks** and (9) **Side Blocks** together to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks.

FINISHING Cut batting and backing 3" larger than top on all sides. Layer backing, batting and top together and baste or pin. When quilting is completed, trim excess batting and backing. Bind as usual.




1. Place (1) **F** 6-1/2" square on the top left corner of (1) **H** 12-1/2" square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.





- **2.** Follow figure below for the seam direction to add an **F** 6-1/2" square to each of the remaining corners of the **H** 12-1/2" square to make (1) **Block One**.
- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (5) Block Ones total.





4. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (5) **G** 12-1/2" squares and (20) **F** 6-1/2" squares to make (5) **Block Twos**.




5. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (2) **A** 12-1/2" squares and (8) **B** 3-1/2" squares to make (2) **Block Threes**.




6. Sew (1) **E** 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" strip to each side of (1) **D** 4-1/2" square. Sew (1) **E** 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the **D** square to make (1) **D-Block**.



7. Sew (1) **C** 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" strip to each side of the **D-Block**. Sew (1) **B** 2-1/2" square to each end of (1) **C** 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the **D-Block**.




- **8.** Sew (1) **E** 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" strip to each side of the **D-Block**. Sew (1) **E** 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the **D-Block** to make (1) **Block Four**.
- 9. Repeat Steps 6-8 to make (6) **Block Fours** total.

10. Follow Figure below and sew the (4) I cornersetting triangles, (10) I side-setting triangles, (5) **Block Ones**, (5) **Block Twos**, (2) **Block Threes** and (6) **Block Fours** together to make the **Center Block**.




11. Pay attention to the fabric direction of the **J** fabric when making the units. Place (1) **J** 3-1/2" square on one corner of (1) **K** 6-1/2" square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press.

Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam to make (1) **Corner Block**. Repeat to make (4) **Corner Blocks** total.

12. Pay attention to the fabric direction of the **J** fabric when making the units. Place (1) **J** 3-1/2" square on the bottom left corner of (1) **K** 6-1/2" square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press.



Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam. Repeat to add a J 3-1/2" square to the lower right corner of the K 6-1/2" square, sewing from the upper right corner to the lower left corner of the smaller square to make (1) **Side Block**. Repeat to make (42) **Side Blocks** total.
