

Finished Quilt Size: 60" $\times 60$ "

FINISHING
Cut batting and backing 3" larger than top on all sides. Layer backing, batting and top completed, trim excess batting and backing Bind as usual.

Note: If this Benartex pattern is included in a kit, any questions about the kit should be addressed to the vendor from whom you bought it.

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Amy's project is so "Tranquil!". She's combined some paper-piecing with the opportunity to show off your machine or hand quilting. It's a fresh new look that is perfect for any room in the house.

## bLock ASSEmbly

1. Center Block Unit: Place a C $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square right side facing up. Take (2) A $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares and place them right sides down in opposite corners. Draw diagonal lines from center to center of each square and stitch along the line. Cut the excess off the corners, leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press triangles out. Repeat for the other two corners to create (1) Center Block Unit. Make 3.
2. Quarter Square Triangle (OST) Unit: Place $51 / 4$ " squares right sides together, pairing one fabric $B$ with a $\mathbf{D}$ or $\mathbf{A}$. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other. Stitch $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from either side of that line. Cut along line. Press HST (half square triangle) units open. match one HST that combines B fabric with D fabric, with another that combines B fabric with A fabric. Again, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner, running perpendicular to the seam you just sewed. Stitch $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ on either side of the line. Cut along line. Press the 2 resulting OST units open. Units will measure $4 \frac{112 \prime \prime}{\prime \prime}$ (unfinished). Make 12.

3. Foundation Piece: Use the foundation pattern piece provided. Place $C$ print in section $A 1$ and $D$ fabric in sections A2 and A3. Trim the blocks along the line provided. Make 28.

4. Block 1: arranging sections as shown in the diagram on the right. Press seams open as you assemble the block. Blocks will be $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ unfinished.
5. Using the remaining foundation pieced units and $D$ $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares, assemble the column to the left on this block. Create 8 of these sections then sew them to the D $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles shown in diagram on bottom right.
6. Assemble Quilt Top following the Quilt Diagram on the following page: Lay out your blocks and background strips on your design wall following the quilt top diagram to assemble.

## QUILT ASSEMBLY

7. Assemble blocks in columns, sew the columns together and then attach the D $241 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 601 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle.
