Festive Roses Panel - 6635P-12	1 panel
Fussy Cut (6) 8-1/2" squares	
Festive Roses Panel - 6635P-42	1 panel
Fussy Cut (6) 8-1/2" squares	
Wave Dark Red - 2966-19	7/8 yd
(2) 2-7/8" strips into:	
(24) 2-7/8" squares	
(3) 2-1/2" strips into:	
(48) 2-1/2" squares	
(5) 2-1/2" strips pieced to make:	
(2) 2-1/2" x 48-1/2"	
(2) 2-1/2" x 36-1/2"	
Festive Lace Green - 6640P-42	1 yd
(1) 2-7/8" strip into:	
(12) 2-7/8" squares	
(7) 2-1/2" strips for Binding	
(8) 1-1/2" strips into:	
(12) 1-1/2" x 4-1/2"	
(12) 1-1/2" x 5-1/2"	
(12) 1-1/2" x 6-1/2"	
(12) 1-1/2" x 7-1/2"	
Festive Damask Black - 6641-12	5/8 yd
(1) 2-7/8" strip into:	
(12) 2-7/8" squares	
(10) 1-1/2" strips into:	
(12) 1-1/2" x 5-1/2"	
(12) 1-1/2" x 6-1/2"	
(12) 1-1/2" x 7-1/2"	
(12) 1-1/2" x 8-1/2"	
Festive Roses Stripe Green - 6636P-42	2-1/8 yds
(4) 9" x length of fabric - centering Roses and scallops	
Backing	3-1/2 yds



Construction:

This project uses precise 1/4" seams. To test your seam allowance, accurately cut (2) 1-1/2" x 3" rectangles. Stitch them together along the 3" length. At the midpoint, measure across the unit. It should be exactly 2-1/2" wide. If not, adjust your seam allowance and repeat.

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the (24) 2-7/8" squares of Wave Dark Red. Place each of these Red squares right sides together with a same size Green or Black square. There will be (12) of each. Stitch an accurate 1/4" on both sides of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line. Press them toward the Red. There will be (24) of each of the units, measuring 2-1/2" square from raw edge to raw edge.



2. Stitch the Step 1 triangle squares in a pinwheel using 2 of each color combination, as shown. Notice the two blacks are on the bottom. Make 12. They measure 4-1/2" square from raw edge to raw edge.



3. Attach a 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" Green along the left edge, and then a 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" Green across the top of all 12 blocks. Press.



4. Sew a 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" Black to the right side and then a 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" Black across the lower edge. Press. They are now 6-1/2" square.



5. Diagonally stitch a 2-1/2" Red square across the Green corner and the Black corner. Trim the excess and press toward the corners. Make 12.



6. As before, add 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" Green to the left, then a 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" Green across the top. Add a 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" Black along the right side and finally a 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" Black across the lower edge. Make 12. They measure 8-1/2" square from raw edge to raw edge.



7. As in Step 5, diagonally stitch 2-1/2" squares of Red across the Green corners and Black Corners. Trim and press. Make 12.



8. Lay out and assemble your quilt using the 12 blocks from Step 7 plus the 12 Rose squares cut from the panels. Press.

9.. Add the 2-1/2" strips of Red to the sides, and then the top and bottom for the inner border.

10. Attach the Rose Stripe Borders. Begin and end at the 1/4" seam allowance at each corner, and leave a 10" miter 'tail' extending.

11. Place a corner to miter on your ironing board, with the border that is lying horizontal extending to the right, and the one that is vertical on top of it and extending up. Fold the top extending border diagonally under and position so it is exactly on top of the one extending to the right. When satisfied it is correct, smash it with the iron.



12. Use a pin or two to hold the mitered corner in place. From the underside, stitch in the pressed crease. Check to see that it's correct and if it is, trim the excess from the seam to 1/4". Press these seams open. Repeat Steps 11-12 for each of the corners to be mitered.



13. Layer your quilt and prepare to quilt your masterpiece. You might like to detail the images.

14. Bind with the 2-1/2" Lace Tonal strips, following the instructions with the Binding Miter Tool. There is also a video demo of this terrific tool at www.YouTube.com
